



Senior Citizen Refuse Service Discount

University City provides a discount on refuse service for senior citizens residing in **single or two-family houses**. If you are at least 65 years of age and there are **no more than two people living in the housing unit** currently utilizing either a roll-out cart or an alley dumpster, you qualify for the senior citizen discount. The number of people in the household will be checked against the most current occupancy permit on file with the Department of Community Development. Request your **free** recycling cart on this application to reduce your household trash even more.

For alley dumpster customers, nothing changes but the price. **However, seniors utilizing a roll-out cart must agree to accept a smaller cart, 60 gallon size, to receive a lower price.**

Reduce your trash.....recycle more!

University City's recycling programs are designed to protect the environment, reduce pollution and, probably just as important to you, keep your refuse rates low. We encourage recycling throughout the community. Our goal is to have 100% of our residents participate in our recycling program!

Since you just applied for the Senior Citizen Refuse Service Discount requesting a smaller 60 gallon trash cart, why not request your **free** recycling cart? Recycling is easy to do! All of your recyclable items can go inside the cart. There is no need to separate materials.

Request your Recycling Cart on this Senior Discount application and reduce your trash even more or call the Public Works and Parks Department at (314) 505-8560.

How Do I Recycle?

You can recycle in **3 easy steps**:

- 1) **Place** all acceptable items inside the cart. Rinse containers first. Avoid placing soiled items in the cart.
- 2) **Roll** the cart to the curb by 7 a.m. on your collection day, or after 5 p.m. on the day before your scheduled collection day.
- 3) **Return** your cart back behind your front building line when empty, but no later than 9 p.m. on the scheduled collection day. Keep the lid closed when not in use.

Recycling is collected once a week at the curbside. If you have a trash cart, recyclables are collected on the same day as trash collection. If you have alley dumpsters, recyclables are collected on the scheduled day for you area.

What Can I Recycle in the Blue Recycling Cart?

Yes, recycle all your:

- Newspaper, magazines, office paper, telephone books, junk mail, envelopes
- Cereal boxes, food mix boxes, pizza boxes, paper egg cartons, beverage cases
- Cardboard boxes (please tear in small pieces and place inside the cart)
- Milk, soda, water and juice bottles/jugs, drink boxes and beverage containers
- Glass jars and bottles, aluminum cans, tin and steel cans or containers
- Laundry and liquid dish soap bottles, dairy products tubs, butter and yogurt tubs, health and beauty containers
- Check for the recycling symbol on the container, #1 – 5 and #7 are acceptable

No, do not recycle,

- #6 plastic, Styrofoam, soiled or dirty containers, construction materials, yard waste, dirt, wood chips, trash, aluminum foil, aluminum pans, ceramic dishes, food waste, toys, window glass, batteries, used auto parts, motor oil, light bulbs, toxic containers, hazardous chemicals, tires, clothing, shoes and bedding
