ST. LOUIS COUNTY ELECTION BOARD STUDENT ELECTION JUDGES PROGRAM

The St. Louis County Board of Election Commissioners is accepting applications for High School students who are interested in the Election Board's *High School Student Election Judge Program*. The Student Election Judge Program gives students an opportunity to work with veteran Election Judges providing hands on experience in learning how elections are conducted. (see Attachment 1)

Participating in the electoral process is an excellent way to promote the importance of civic engagement and instill a sense of public responsibility in our young people as they enter adulthood. This can also be a great opportunity for students to earn community service hours for graduation requirements or earn a wage for working at a polling place on Election Day.

To qualify, students must be at least 15 but under 18 years of age, and be in the 10th, 11th, or 12th grade. The Election Board also encourages **high school students who are of 18 years of age to apply as regular Election Judges**. Public Works

Residential Street Sweeping begins in the Private Subdivisions on Monday, September 27 and will be performed in that work week. This service is intended to reduce the materials entering the sewer system and improve the appearance and cleanliness of City streets. Please do use residential driveways as available for parking during the week in the service area in order for the department to conduct an effective street sweeping.

City-wide Bulk Item Collection begins in the West area on Monday, September 27 and will be performed in that work week. Accepted bulk items include furniture and appliances. Electronics will no longer be accepted in the bulk item collection. Participating residents are asked to place no more than 3 large items or 7 smaller items within 1-3 feet of curb or street pavement for collection.

Fall Curbside Leaf Collection is coming up! This season's work is scheduled to begin in the East area in the work week starting on Monday, November 1, 2021. We ask that our residents rake their leaves to the curb line between the Friday before collection begins in your area and Monday 7 AM of your collection week. The truck will make only one pass per household. Please do not mix other yard waste (gumballs, trash, small tree branches/limbs, brush, grass clippings, etc.) in with leaves and continue using the yard waste collection service for the disposal of other yard waste and contact the department office at (314) 505-8560 with any questions.

*EARN COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS OR
GET PAID FOR YOUR TIME!*

REQUIREMENTS:

- Be a United States citizen
- Be at least 15 but under 18 and in the 10th, 11th or 12th grade
- Be in good academic standing
- Have permission from parent or legal guardian and school
- Be willing and able to serve their assignment from 5 a.m. to approximately 8 p.m. on Election Day
- Be able to attend election training
- Have transportation to and from the assigned polling place
- Not be related to a candidate on the ballot at the assigned polling place
- Work without partisan bias and without promoting any point of view on a candidate or issue
