Residential Parking Permit Plan Guidelines

When can parking be restricted on public residential streets?

Parking on public streets within residential neighborhoods may be restricted to the residents for up to three blocks of a street, under two conditions:

1. The residential block contains a commercial area comprising multiple retail businesses; the daily traffic count exceeds two thousand five hundred (2,500) vehicles on any part of the block containing the commercial area; and the problems caused by nonresident parking on the block are chronic and well-documented; **or**,
2. The street is within two blocks of Washington University or another municipality's boundary and the problems caused by nonresident parking* on the block are chronic and well-documented.

*Nonresident parking refers to parking spaces occupied by individuals who do not live on the street.

What are the steps to request implementation of a Residential Parking Permit Plan?

Residential Parking Permit General Guidelines:

- Streets can be restricted up to twelve (12) hours daily to be specifically recommended by the traffic commission after consideration of the business and residential needs.
- Unless exempt, applicants for individual permits must possess a valid University City occupancy permit for an address on the designated block(s), and a current state motor vehicle registration certificate for each permit requested. The motor vehicle must be registered or leased to an individual listed on the occupancy permit. A permit can be obtained for each vehicle owned/leased by the resident.
- A maximum of two transferable visitor permits can be obtained for each residence regardless of whether the resident owns an automobile.
- The permit does not guarantee or reserve a particular parking space within the restricted area. It allows permit holders general parking in the restricted area during the restricted hours as posted.
- The permit does not apply to corporations or individuals who are performing commercial services, repairs, or emergency assistance for any resident living in the specified area.
